Let our daily lives...

Usually when we speak of a *mystery*, we think of a story that needs to be solved before we reach the last page of the book or the film finishes. When the Church speaks of *mystery*, she is speaking of a truth that is incomprehensible to reason and is knowable only through divine revelation. The Early Church referred to the sacraments as the *mysteries*. The main events of the Jesus' ongoing action in our world we call the Mystery of Faith. At the most solemn moment in the Mass, after the Bread and Wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, we proclaim the *Mystery of Faith*. Saint Paul reminds the Colossians, and us, that we have received *Mystery*; the Mystery that Christ is in us. We can go about our day lives so determined to do this that we can forget about the wonderful mystery that Christ is with, and in, us. Like Martha, in the Gospel, we can be more concerned with doing rather than just being. Martha was doing in her efforts to prepare for Jesus. Mary, her sister, was concerned with being, with being with Jesus. Let us be more aware of Him with us in all we do in this coming week.

LATEST NEWS ON LVRS (Lune Valley Refugee Sponsorship). We have heard from Sean Ryan that Mark Wiggin (Director of Caritas Salford) has today received the following news in an email from the Home Office: *I am delighted to inform you we have approved Caritas - Lune Valley Refugee Sponsorship Project application to become a Community Sponsor.* In his email, Sean writes: "Very many congratulations to you and the whole group for reaching this point, at long last, and I am so sorry that the application process to date has been so much longer than any of us would have preferred. Regarding timescales from here, once we have reached agreement that a family referral is suitable and Caritas has accepted the referral formally on your behalf, there will be a period of six weeks or slightly longer before the family arrives. At this stage I would therefore estimate that your family will be arriving in the first half of September." This means that we have received confirmation from the Home Office that our application to become a community sponsor has been formally approved. We have also been given limited information about the family, which they currently have in mind, for us to host. With the support of our lead sponsor, Caritas Salford, we will need to carefully assess the full documentary details, once they have been received, before reaching any kind of firm decision. The current expectation is that the hosted family will arrive at the beginning of September. **Watch this space! And please keep this project in your prayers.**
