Today's readings are about the cost of discipleship. Such a cost is not what we want to hear. We don't want to hear that choosing Christ will put our lives so at odds with those around us that we will be persecuted and mocked. We want our religion to be easy. We don't want to have to pay a price for living our faith. But we must. We have chosen Christ therefore we must make difficult decisions in order to be the People of God, not just slaves to the world. We accept this cost because we are more concerned with others than ourselves. We are concerned for their eternal salvation not so much with what they can do to us in this life. In today's Gospel Jesus says, I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were ablaze already! The fire is the fire of God's love. That is what we are about. We know we are loved. We know that God wants others to join us in His Love. If we are truly going to be His disciples, then we will happily join the Lord in setting the world on fire with love. And we will do this no matter what personal cost this entails: For the cost of discipleship is temporary, but the Treasure of God's Love is forever.

# The Road to Sanctity - John Bradburne

Saturday  $7^{th}$  September 2019, 10:00 am - 3:00 pm, St Thomas More Parish Centre, LA1 5PT

Professor David Crystal will lead the day, including DVDs. Discussion, shared food and prayer.

The Vatican has approved the Sainthood cause of John Bradburne, the British Franciscan missionary murdered in Zimbabwe by pro-Mugabe fighters. The John Bradburne Memorial Society confirmed that the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome issued a formal "nilhil obstat" on 1 July, allowing the Cause to begin.

Bradburne, born in Skirwith, Cumbria in 1921, was shot in 1979 during the Rhodesian liberation war after he refused to abandon the Leper community where he worked. Accused of being a spy for the white regime, guerrilla fighters loyal to Mugabe are said to have offered Bradburne the chance to flee the country. He refused, knelt to pray and was shot in the back.

The Cause will be officially launched on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2019, the fortieth anniversary of his murder.
