#### Covid-19 Guidance

- Whilst we are taking our utmost care to ensure that our buildings are Covid-safe, 'vulnerable' parishioners are asked to think carefully, particularly with Lancashire on Tier 3 alert, before attending Holy Mass.
- We are severely restricting numbers in the church buildings, to ensure social distancing, and everyone is required to sanitise their hands on entry and to keep the nose and mouth covered whilst in the building [unless medical conditions prevent you from doing so].
- We will also take a contact number for all attendees. These details will be destroyed after 21 days according to data management regulations.
- The churches are cleaned using a 'fogging' system after each celebration of Holy Mass, if you are visiting for private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at St. Mary's Hornby please clean your space using wipes after use.

### Reflecting on the Word of God

God's breaking point

Every parent, no matter how patient, has a breaking point. Even a parent who can tolerate endless noise and outrageous disobedience from his children will finally blow up when his breaking point is reached. In the First Reading, God tells us what his breaking point is. It has to do with those people who are 'foreigners' and orphans.

Some people live as strangers in a strange land; they are foreigners in their own communities. And some people lack love and care. They are like orphans, alone, without a home.

You might suppose that these foreigners and orphans are easy to recognise. They are the ones without money, or the ones without a family, you might think. But there you would be mistaken. People rarely are so transparent. There can be foreigners and orphans among the rich and powerful, just as there can be much loved and cared for people who live among the poor. You just don't know.

But here is what we do know, from the First Reading. If something you do makes someone, who lives as an orphan or a foreigner, cry to God in their suffering, God will lose all patience with you. He will blow up at you, and sooner or later you will know what it is to have made God angry at you.

This ought to be a very alarming prospect to us.

But what is the point of this thought? Is it to make us always anxious and scared of God? No, of course not! What good would we be to anyone in that condition?

The point is rather to make us watchful of the way in which we treat any one of God's children. Let us look at each person who crosses our path, each one, rich or poor, obnoxious or likeable, as under the protection of the God who is Father in Heaven to us all. Let us make sure that we do not cause any person to cry to God by what we say or do to him. And let us join with God in losing all patience with those who afflict God's hopeless or homeless children.

Then what we will know is not the wrath of the Lord, but the joy that comes from being with God in his love.

October - Month of the Holy Rosary

Please think about praying the rosary each day during the month of October - perhaps for the intention of the spiritual renewal of the parish, particularly among young and lapsed Catholics and for an end to the Covid crisis.

#### Christmas

It does seem early for our minds to turn to Christmas but current restrictions are likely to remain in place for some time and will impact on our liturgical celebrations...best to be prepared.

We do not want to turn families away from Masses over the Christmas period due to our limited capacity. We therefore intend to create a 'pop up' church for Christmas - a large marquee with flooring, heating and lighting in the garden of St. Mary to enable a worthy celebration of the Solemnity of the Incarnation and help bring a bit of light in this difficult situation. This will have the capacity to accommodate the numbers usually present at Christmas Masses.

What's the catch? There will be a cost for this - around £1600. If you would like to help cover the costs you are welcome to contribute. Place any donations in an envelope marked 'Christmas Church'. Any donations above the cost will go to 'Mary's Meals'.

Thank you for those who have donated this week - donations received [from Kirkby Lonsdale] total around £500.

#### Month of the Holy Souls - November

Envelopes are available for the 'November List'. A Novena of Masses will be offered for those included on the 'November List'. Include members of your family, friends etc who have died in the envelope. It is customary to make an offering which should be included in the envelope.

#### Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Due to the Tier 3 Covid Status, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is suspended for the time beina.

#### Sacrament of Reconciliation

#### Patrimony Inventory & Insurance

The annual diocesan insurance schedule has arrived. In order to ascertain whether there is adequate insurance cover for the parish, over the coming weeks an inventory process will take place to record parish patrimony [for example, chalices etc]. Mr Bruno Ormsby of Ormsby's of Scarisbrick will record and produce a report on the majority of items but Mr Christopher Zeally of St. Philips Books in Oxford will also assist with this process.

The diocese requires that all items that are of particular value or note are specifically listed on the insurance schedule.

#### Remembrance Sunday

Due to Covid restrictions the usual acts of Remembrance are severely curtailed this year. There will be a limited presence at Hornby around 11.00 am. Fr Michael will attend to represent the Catholic community. The Royal British Legion are encouraging people to gather for the minutes silence on their own doorsteps. A Requiem Mass will be offered for the fallen and the Mass will start at a slightly later time of 11.30 am that Sunday.
