

Formation in the faith...coming soon!

On Tuesdays following the evening Mass at Caton we'll begin a regular programme of faith formation: we have a rich and beautiful heritage as Catholics and it is great to know that we can learn more about it.

This Tuesday-evening slot will begin with refreshments after Mass and then an opportunity to explore the riches of our faith using a variety of resources

This autumn we have the opportunity to explore Bishop Robert Barron's series -'Catholicism'. One review said: "The Catholic Church has certainly faced some difficult challenges in recent years. Sex scandals, bishops who looked the other way, and a shortage of priests are seared into the consciousness of many within and outside this faith tradition. Barron, a Catholic bishop and a former professor of theology at Mundelein Seminary near Chicago, draws attention back to the beautiful and rich tradition of this two-millennia-old religion. The author is able to set politics aside and examine the true heart of the Catholic faith God, Jesus, the Virgin Mary, and the numerous devotional practices and dogmas that have developed over the centuries. He casts a spotlight on some of the holy people who have helped build up the church, such as Dorothy Day, Thomas Merton, Katharine Drexel, and Mother Teresa. Barron's engaging stories help to dissect and explain complex theological tenets. One comes to understand that Catholicism transcends religious practice; it is a lifestyle. Those who would like a concise but substantive introduction to the Catholic faith need look no further.

Why not come along to these evenings? It's a great opportunity to spend the evening with fellow parishioners and learn more about the faith that we love.

It is part of Christian doctrine that only Christians can be saved. No one comes to the Father except by Christ (John 14:6). This is a view that can encourage tribalism.

In the Gospel Reading, the apostles see someone who is not among the group of Christ's disciples but who is casting out demons in the name of Christ anyway. When the apostles perceive the man doing a miracle in Christ's name, they tell him to stop it. As the apostles see it, unless a person is a member of their group, their tribe, he is an outsider; and, as an outsider, he is not among the saved. In the view of the apostles, that is why there is something wrong about that outsider's using God's power to do miracles.

In response, Christ defends the outsider and rebukes the tribalism of his apostles. "Whoever is not against us is for us," Christ tells the disciples. The outsider has not joined the disciples, and he doesn't know the doctrines or customs that the disciples are learning from Christ. But, in Christ's view, he is still one of Christ's own.

So it is true that no one comes to the Father except by Christ.

But this requirement makes Christ the one necessary and sufficient condition for salvation. It doesn't say anything about any of the other ways by which members of a group usually identify themselves. As Christ sees that outsider, the man meets the one requisite condition for salvation: he is for Christ. And so, in Christ's view, that outsider counts as one of those who come to the Father by Christ, even if he is not an official member of Christ's disciples.

But then, you might say, who doesn't count as one of Christ's own? Who actually is against Christ?

In effect, Christ answers these questions by giving an example of a group destined for perdition. It is the group of those who draw children away from the Lord or who make the vulnerable and helpless worse than they otherwise would be. Those in that group would be better off being dropped into the sea with millstones around their necks, Christ says.

So here is what we need to remember. Even Judas was a member of the official tribe of Christ's disciples; but in the end Judas was not one of Christ's own. Real membership in the group of those who are Christ's own depends on being for Christ, and for those he loves.

Synodality

The next Synod of Bishops will be held in Rome in October 2023 with the theme, 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.' However, the synodal journey will begin with the official opening of the Synod in Rome on 9 October 2021. The 'diocesan phase' of this Synod will start in every diocese on October 17. 2021. It will be followed by the 'continental phase' in September-October 2022 and the 'universal phase' at the Vatican in October 2023. What is a Synod? According to Canon Law, Synod is a 'group of bishops who have been chosen from different regions of the world and meet together at fixed times to foster closer unity between the Roman Pontiff and bishops to assist the Roman Pontiff with their counsel in the preservation and growth of faith and morals and in the observance and strengthening of ecclesiastical discipline, and to consider questions pertaining to the activity of the Church in the world'. (Can. #314). Established by Pope Paul VI toward the end of Vatican Council II, the Synod of Bishops meets the Ordinary General Assemblies every 3-4years. There are also Extraordinary General Assemblies and Special Assemblies convened by the Pope from time to time. As Pope Paul VI wrote, the Synodal Assembly has 'a consultative role, offering information and counsel to the Roman Pontiff on various ecclesiastical questions, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.'
