We will be presenting a cheque of £1125 to the Morecambe Bay Foodbank and Uniform Shop after Half Term and have already sent £1200 to the Home of Divine Mercy Vocational School. Father Sunday is visiting Uganda next week and he will be using the money to start the construction of the floor of the Girls' Dormitory. We hope to raise more funds over Christmas so that this can be completed as soon as possible. Funds which we have sent over the last few months have enabled the eaves and roof to be completed (see photos on next page)

Turing Scheme News

We have been extremely fortunate to receive a very generous grant from the Turing Scheme, administered by the British Council. This has enabled us to offer very low cost places to disadvantaged students and also to offer places to any students with disabilities. This is enabling us to 'widen participation' and we are currently selecting a team of 16 students from our Sixth Form to travel to Uganda for 18 days on 11 July 2022. They will be accompanied by a team of staff and some young adult volunteers who had the Uganda 2020 trip postponed. All the funding is in place for this party of 29, the biggest group we have ever taken. This means all of our fund raising is once again ring-fenced for the Ugandan communities.
