Reflecting on the Word of God



Love your enemies

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus commands us to love our enemies. In other words, every one of us is commanded to love each person who counts as an enemy to us.

Many people suppose that no one except a saint could fulfil this command. Other people think that this command is nothing more than permission to connive with evil, because if you love your enemy instead of clobbering him, you enable him to continue his wrongdoing.

But consider what love is. As Aquinas explains it, love consists in two desires: (1) a desire for the good for the beloved person, and (2) a desire for union with that person. So a person Paula loves her enemy Jerome only if she desires the good for Jerome and union with Jerome.

But now notice that what the good for Jerome is will depend on Jerome. Desiring Jerome's good requires Paula's foregoing punishment for him if that would be for his good—or insisting on punishment for him if that would be for his good. What is best for Jerome is whatever it takes to bring him to a morally good condition in mind and will; and that might include Paula's calling the police to arrest him.

For this same reason, Paula's desire for union with Jerome need not include a desire for companionship with him. If Jerome is entirely unrepentant, then Paula's desire for union with him should not involve a willingness to be in his company. In that worst case, Paula's desire for union with Jerome can appropriately come to no more than the desire that Jerome will repent and reform, so that companionship becomes a possibility for them.

The desire of love is a desire to be at one with the beloved person, but you can be unified with a person only if you each love the good. The proverb says that there is no honour among thieves, but there is no unity among them either. To love your enemy, then, is not to enable him to continue to do morally wrong acts against you or anybody else either.

If you want what is good for your enemy, you will want for him what you want for yourself: to be a person who has love for the Lord and obedience to him. And if you want union with your enemy, you won't want him to go to hell because he has hurt you. You will be glad if in love and obedience to the Lord, he finds his way to heaven too. So that is what it is to love your enemy. Each one of us can do this, can't we?

First Holy Communion

The course will begin on Ash Wednesday - 2nd March. There will be an introductory evening for parents on Wednesday 23rd February at 4.30 pm where application forms will be distributed.

Other Notices:

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent is on Wednesday 2nd March. It is hoped Masses with the distribution of Ashes will take place in all of our churches.

It was agreed at recent Parish Mission Team meetings that the Easter Triduum [Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday] will be celebrated in one venue. Last year this was Hornby, this year will be St. Joseph's Kirkby Lonsdale, and next year Caton. Easter Sunday Masses will be celebrated in Kirkby Lonsdale and Caton with an early morning Mass in Hornby.

Changes in the Education Service.

The Diocesan School Commissioner [who replaced Canon Luiz] is moving on to take up a new position with the national Catholic Education Service. Fr Michael will be covering her work until a recruitment process is concluded [probably September at the earliest].

This may result in adjustments to the weekday Mass schedule in coming months.

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has arranged for the relics of Saint Bernadette to be brought to England this vear. Her relics will be welcomed to St Peter's Cathedral from the evening of September 23rd through to the late morning of September 24th. Mindful that the Diocesan Chief Patroness is Our Lady of Lourdes, we must look on this as a very special moment in the life of the Diocese. This event provides an invitation for all of us to know the story of Saint Bernadette and to give her a place in our devotion. She has much to teach us in the ways of humility and trust. Many of you may recall the occasion when the Cathedral welcomed the relics of St. Therese of Lisieux. Unfortunately, this forthcoming occasion is much shorter There will also be need for a team of volunteers to facilitate those coming to venerate St Bernadette's relics: if you would like to volunteer to help please see Fr Michael.
