World Mission Sunday

- Whilst we are taking our utmost care to ensure that our buildings are Covid-safe, 'vulnerable'

 your space using wipes after use.

The First Reading says that the Lord of hosts will provide a feast for his people, a feast of choice wines and rich and juicy food.

Rich food is the kind that our culture warns us against. Everything shouts at us that if we want to look good and be healthy, the one thing we should be sure to avoid is rich food. And what can we say about choice wines? They cost a lot of money, which could be better spent on other things; and nobody can exercise hard or work well who is full of choice wines.

Furthermore, almost everybody is dieting or has been dieting. But we all know that even successful dieters fail in the long run. Often, a person diets just long enough to get rid of excess weight and then happily goes right back to his old habits of eating rich and juicy food. That's how diets fail.

We seem pressed, then, to give up rich and juicy things forever. And it isn't just a matter of food. Work, marriage, children—all these things can give the same impression. Give unstintingly, labor ceaselessly; but, please, please, nothing rich and juicy! At least, not if you want to be healthy, attractive, and successful.

This is a grim and grinding picture of human life. But it is not the Lord's picture. We are made by him to be fed till we are full with the very best, the most rich and juicy of all. The Lord himself will provide it for us in heaven, in the wedding supper of the Lamb.

But, in this life too, the Lord feeds us with the best—and that is himself, in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. There is no choicer wine or richer food.

And so, as the First Reading shows us, we are not commanded to a life of grimness. We are called to feasting with joy

October - Month of the Holy Rosary

October is the month set aside to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title 'Our Lady of the Holy Rosary'. This commemorates the victory achieved through Her intercession at the Battle of Lepanto on 7th October 1571. Please think about praying the rosary each day during the month of October - perhaps for the intention of the spiritual renewal of the parish, particularly among young and lapsed Catholics and for an end to the Covid crisis

Christmas

It does seem early for our minds to turn to Christmas but current restrictions are likely to remain in place for some time and will impact on our liturgical celebrations...best to be prepared.

We do not want to turn families away from Masses over the Christmas period due to our limited capacity. We therefore intend to create a 'pop up' church for Christmas - a large marquee with flooring, heating and lighting in the garden of St. Mary to enable a worthy celebration of the Solemnity of the Incarnation and help bring a bit of light in this difficult situation. This will have the capacity to accommodate the numbers usually present at Christmas Masses.

What's the catch? There will be a cost for this - around £1600. If you would like to help cover the costs you are welcome to contribute. Place any donations in an envelope marked 'Christmas Church'. Any donations above the cost will go to 'Mary's Meals'.

Please consider attending for personal prayer on Thursday evening at Kirkby Lonsdale and on Friday evening at Hornby. On Friday, Holy Communion is distributed to those who are unable to attend Mass at other times after Benediction.

Foundation Directors

The Diocese of Lancaster is forming a number of Multi-Academy Trusts following the decision of the Bishop and Trustees to academise Voluntary Aided schools across the diocese. As a consequence of this the Bishop is seeking to appoint a number of Foundation Directors initially for a Trust in Cumbria. The role of a Foundation Director is that of a company director in company law and a charitable trustee in charity law and individuals will be required to register at Companies House. Appointments are made to ensure a range of professional skills across the board which will allow the board to carry out its duties proficiently e.g., educationalists, accountancy, legal, HR, health and safety specialists etc. Appointees are expected to understand the ethos of Catholic education and be involved in the work of the Church, often as active parishioners in their own
