**What was it St Augustine said...**

This week we come to the climax of chapter six of St John's Gospel which looks at what it means to consume the Lord's Body and Blood. Normally, when we eat, we assimilate the food. But that is not the case when we receive the Eucharist. No, instead of us assimilating the food, the food assimilates us. When we receive the Eucharist, we take on the life of the Lord and ...anyone who eats this bread will live for ever. In receiving Holy Communion we receive Jesus strengthening us and transforming our joys and sorrows into prayers to His Father. This union with Jesus in the Eucharist is a union with Him in His passion, death and resurrection. Sometimes we are full of the joy of the Resurrection, sometimes the sorrow of the Passion, but always we are strengthened by the one who gives us His Body and Blood. Let us pray for Reverence, a Gift of the Holy Spirit. May we always venerate the living and Real Presence of Jesus that assimilates us into Himself every time we receive His Body and Blood. In the Eucharist we truly put on Christ, who is love.

## **Annual Pilgrimage to the Diocesan shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes at Cleator on Sunday 2nd September 2018.**

The principal celebrant and preacher will be Bishop Paul Swarbrick. The theme this year is Our Lady, Queen of Peace. This year marks the 100th anniversary of the end of the 'Great' war. The staff and pupils of St Patrick's School have prepared a moving display in church that helps us count the cost of war. As well as having a beautiful replica of the Lourdes grotto, we also have in the grounds of the shrine at Cleator statues of the Curé of Ars and of St Thérèse of Lisieux. The pilgrimage will be an opportunity not only to honour Mary the Mother of God, but also these two great saints, and to ask their intercession for healing and consolation. As usual we invite the young people, age 16+, of our Diocese to walk in pilgrimage from Honister across Haystacks into Ennerdale then on to Cleator. They will begin their journey at Castlerigg Manor on Friday 31st August. The event is a great opportunity to make new friends and to triumph over a physical challenge. The walk is about 10 miles each day and concludes with the diocesan Mass at Cleator at 3 pm. Tea and coffee will be available before and after Mass in the parish room.
